How Many Stations of the Cross Are There? There are traditionally fourteen Stations of the Cross. Each station represents a different moment in Jesus' Passion and Death, including:

- 1. Jesus is Condemned to Death
- 2. Jesus Carries the Cross
- 3. Jesus Falls for the First Time
- 4. Jesus Meets His Mother
- 5. Simon Helps Jesus Carry His Cross
- 6. Veronica Wipes the Face of Jesus
- 7. Jesus Falls a Second Time
- 8. Jesus Meets the Women of Jerusalem
- 9. Jesus Falls a Third Time
- 10. Jesus is Stripped of His Garments
- 11. Jesus is Nailed to the Cross
- 12. Jesus Dies on the Cross
- 13. Jesus' Body is Removed from the Cross
- 1. Jesus is Laid in the Tomb
